Attendance is **FREE** with refreshments and lunch provided.



Study Team news

The BASL End of Life Special Interest Group (EoL SIG) meeting was held on Thursday 7th November in Birmingham. It was great to see some of you there in person.



Some important key points from presentation:

- Most SARs are related to leakage and occur in first 2-4 weeks so needs close collaboration with community teams. Early detection avoids hospitalisations
- Recruitment: we need 8 per month and there are 4 months when we need 11
- Please ensure SFLDQoL is completed first and check that all questions are answered








Study Team news

Some more important key points from presentation:

- Proxy Scores are when the researcher / caregiver completes questionnaires on behalf of research participant and <u>NOT</u> when researcher / caregiver enters responses on behalf of participant
- EoL does not equate to withdrawing a research participant:
 - they can stay in trial if patient / caregiver willing and death not imminent
 - Retention is crucial to enable robust statistical analysis
 - Please identify the caregiver at screening

MACRO:

- 3. Haemorrhagic
- 2. Yellow or turbid
- 1. Clear or Straw-colour

Modified AHCR Questionnaires

Should be completed every 2 weeks from Baseline even if there is no caregiver.

Where there is **no caregiver** patient to complete:

Section 1: Health and Social Care Visits / Appointments Inside the Home

- Section 2: Healthcare Visits / Appointments / Stays Outside the Home
- Section 3: New Supplies and Equipment (Weeks 2 onwards only)

Section 5: Participant Symptom / Functional Assessment (*caregiver or participant*) Section 7: Out-of-pocket Expenditures

Caregiver only to complete:

Section 4: Caregiving Section 6: Caregiver's Burden Scale In End-of-life Care Section 8: Caregiver Views about Healthcare and Social Services Received
